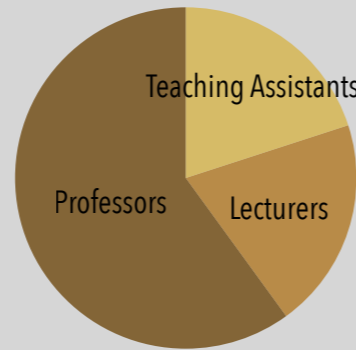

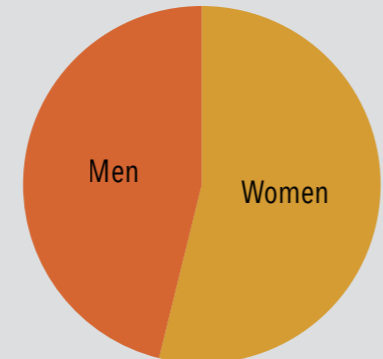

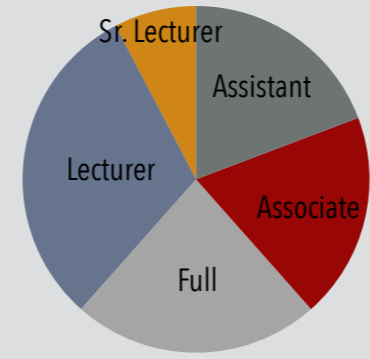

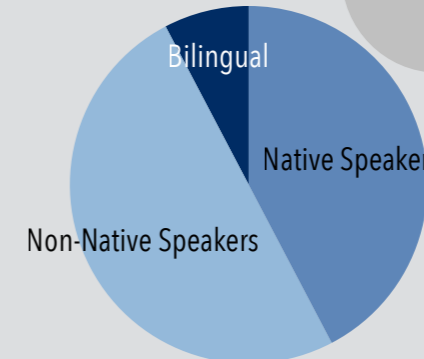
geographic distribution of faculty



distribution of faculty by gender

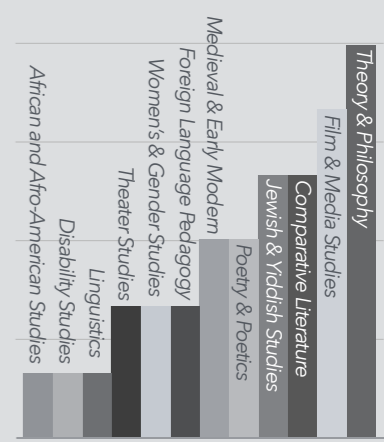


distribution of faculty by rank

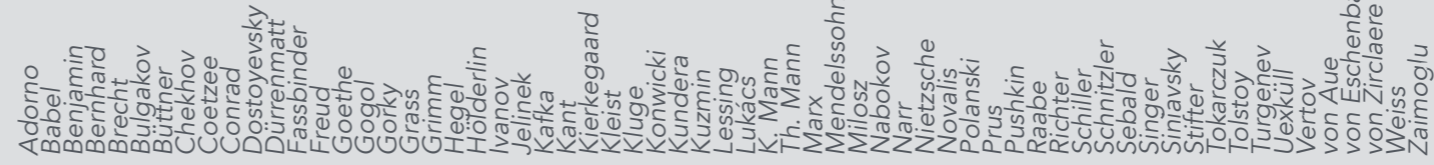
