☆ Were the Cold War and division inevitable?

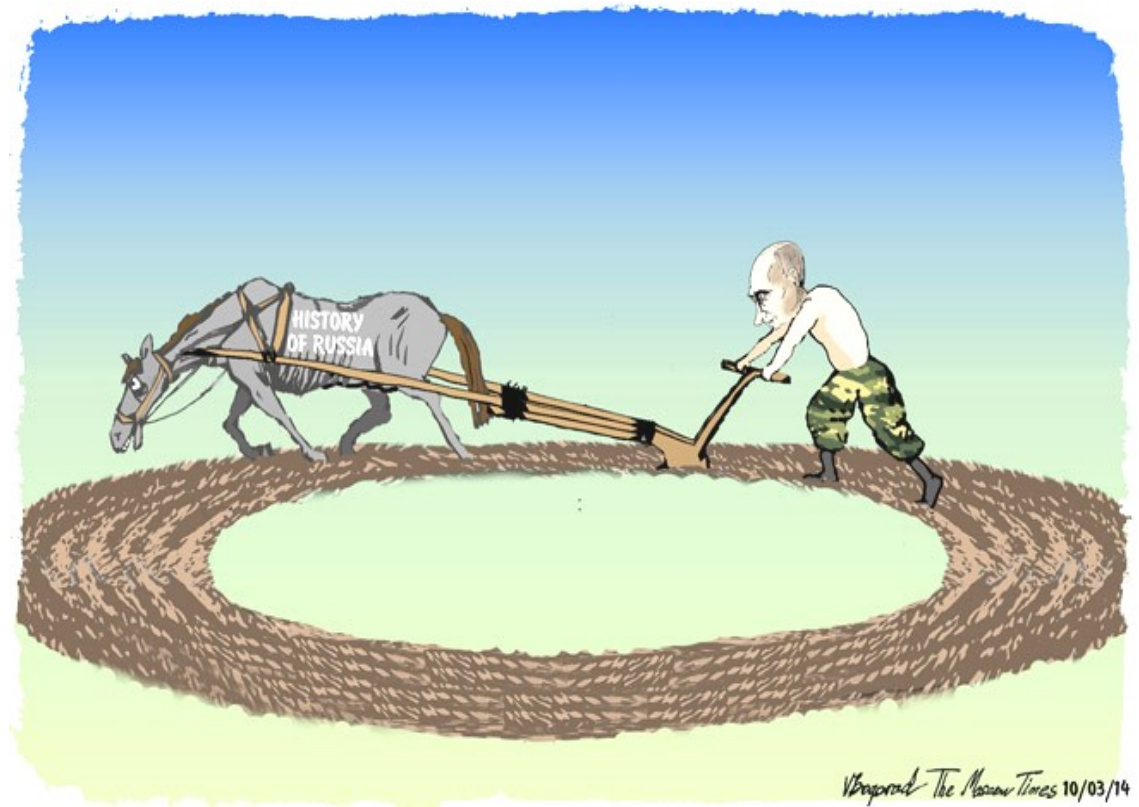
